(h) the Traveller community ground of the student or the applicant in respect of the student concerned, or (i) the ground that the student or the applicant in respect of the student concerned has special educational needs.

As per section 61 (3) of the Education Act 1998, 'civil status ground', 'disability ground', 'discriminate', 'family status ground', 'gender ground', 'ground of race', 'religion ground', 'sexual orientation ground' and 'Traveller community ground' shall be construed in accordance with section 3 of the Equal Status Act 2000.

Clogheen-Kerry Pike NS is a school whose objective is to provide education in an environment which promotes certain religious values and does not discriminate where it refuses to admit as a student a person who is not Roman Catholic and it is proved that the refusal is essential to maintain the ethos of the school.

Clogheen-Kerry Pike NS is a school which has established classes, with the approval of the Minister for Education and Skills, which provides an education exclusively for students with a category or categories of special educational needs specified by the Minister, and may refuse to admit to the classes a student who does not have the category of needs specified.

4. Admission of Students

school student This shall admit each seeking admission except where school is oversubscribed (please see "Oversubscription" below for further details) b) a parent of a student, when required by the principal in accordance with section 23(4) of the Education (Welfare) Act 2000, fails to confirm in writing that the code of behaviour of the school is acceptable to him or her and that he or she shall make all reasonable efforts to ensure compliance with such code by the student.

The special classes attached to Clogheen-Kerry Pike NS provide an education exclusively for students with Autism/Autistic Spectrum Disorder and the school may refuse admission to this class, where the student concerned does not have the specified category of special educational needs provided for in this class.

Categories of Special Educational Needs catered for in the special class

Clogheen-Kerry Pike NS, with the approval of the Minister for Education and Skills, has established classes to provide an education exclusively for students with Autism/Autistic Spectrum Disorder.

The child must have a primary diagnosis of Autism/ Autistic Spectrum Disorder made using the DSM-V or ICD 10 by the psychologist or member of the Multi-Disciplinary team.

5. Oversubscription

In the event that the school is oversubscribed, the school will, when deciding on applications for admission, apply the following selection criteria in the order listed below to those applications that are received within the timeline for receipt of applications as set out in the school's annual admission notice:

Mainstream: Criteria

In the event that application for enrolment exceeds/is expected to exceed the number of places available, the following decision-making process will apply. The Board of Management will exercise its discretion in the application of the following criteria:

- 1. Children who have siblings already attending the School
- 2. Children who live within the traditional parish boundaries
- 3. Children of Staff members
- 4. Children of past pupils
- 5. First come, first served

In the event that there are two or more students tied for a place or places in any of the selection criteria categories above (the number of applicants exceeds the number of remaining places), the following arrangements will apply:

The student, whose application arrives at the School first, will be allocated the place.

Special Class: Criteria

- 1. Current pupil of the school-pupils transferring from our mainstream classes
- 2. Siblings of present pupils of the school
- 3. Children of all current school staff
- 4. Applicants whose primary residence is in the immediate catchment area which is determined as the parish of Clogheen Kerry Pike
- 5. Applicants whose primary residence is in the extended catchment area
- 6. Children of past pupils
- 7. Age of the child

9. Acceptance of an offer of a place by an applicant

accepting offer of admission from Clogheen-Kerry Pike NS. must indicateyou (i) whether or not you have accepted an offer of admission for another school or schools. If you have accepted such an offer, provide details of the offer or offers concerned (ii) whether or not you have applied for and awaiting confirmation of an offer of admission from another school or schools, and if so, you must provide details of the other school or schools concerned.

10. Circumstances in which offers may not be made or may be withdrawn

An offer of admission may not be made or may be withdrawn by Clogheen-Kerry Pike NS where established that information contained in the application is false or (ii) an applicant fails to confirm acceptance of an offer of admission on or before the date set out in the annual admission notice (iii) the parent of a student, when required by the principal in accordance with section 23(4) of the Education (Welfare) Act 2000, fails to confirm in writing that the code of behaviour of the school is acceptable to him or her and that he or she shall reasonable efforts to ensure compliance with such code by (iv) an applicant has failed to comply with the requirements of 'acceptance of an offer' as set out in section 10 above.

11. Sharing of Data with other schools

Applicants should be aware that section 66(6) of the Education (Admission to Schools) Act 2018 allows for the sharing of certain information between schools in order to facilitate the efficient admission of students.

Section 66(6) allows a school to provide a patron or another board of management with a list of the students in relation to whom—

12. Waiting list in the event of oversubscription

In the event of there being more applications to the school year concerned than places available, a waiting list of students whose applications for admission to Clogheen-Kerry Pike NS were unsuccessful due to the school being oversubscribed will be compiled and will remain valid for the school year in which admission is being sought.

Placement on the waiting list of Clogheen-Kerry Pike NS is in the order of priority assigned to the students' applications after the school has applied the selection criteria in accordance with this admission policy.

Applicants whose applications are received after the closing date, outlined in the Annual Admission Notice, will be placed at the end of the waiting list in order of the date of receipt of the application.

Offers of any subsequent places that become available for and during the school year in relation to which admission is being sought will be made to those students on the waiting list, in accordance with the order of priority in relation to which the students have been placed on the list.

13. Late Applications

All applications for admission received after the closing date as outlined in the annual admission notice will be considered and decided upon in accordance with our school's admissions policy, the Education Admissions to School Act 2018 and any regulations made under that Act.

Late applicants will be notified of the decision in respect of their application no later than three weeks after the date on which the school received the application. Late applicants will be offered a place if there is place available. In the event that there is no place available, the name of the applicant will be added to the waiting list as set out above.

14. Procedures for admission of students to other years and during the school year

Under Section 29 of the Education Act 1998, may appeal a decision of this school to refuse admission.

An appeal may be made under Section 29 (1) (c) (i) of the Education Act 1998 where the refusal to admit was due to the school being oversubscribed.

An appeal may be made under Section 29 (1) (c) (ii) of the Education Act 1998 where the refusal to admit was due a reason other than the school being oversubscribed.

Where an applicant has been refused admission due to the school being oversubscribed, the applicant **must request a review** of that decision by the Board of Management **prior to making an appeal** under section 29 of the Education Act 1998. (see Review of decisions by the Board of Management)

Where an applicant has been refused admission due to a reason other than the school being oversubscribed, the applicant may request a review of that decision by the Board of Management prior to making an appeal under section 29 of the Education Act 1998. (see Review of decisions by the Board of Management)

Appeals under Section 29 of the Education Act 1998 will be considered and determined by an independent appeals committee appointed by the Minister for Education and Skills.

The timeline within which such an appeal must be made and the other requirements applicable to such appeals are set out in the procedures determined by the Minister under section 29B of the Education Act 1998 which are published on the website of the Department of Education and Skills.

In accordance with Section 62 of the Education (admissions to school's act), the board of management of Clogheen / Kerry Pike NS has included the following text to the schools' admissions statement, as required by the Education (provision in respect of children with special educational needs) act 2022.

Clogheen / Kerry Pike NS will cooperate with the National Council for Special Education in the performance by the Council of its functions under the Education for Persons with Special Educational Needs Act 2004 relating to the provision of education to children with special educational needs, including in particular by the provision and operation of a special class or classes when requested to do so by the Council.

Clogheen / Kerry Pike NS will comply with any direction served on the patron or the board, as the case may be, under section 37A and any direction served on the board under section 67(4B) of the Education Act.
